

High suspense until the very last second. But time was not only a decisive factor in the Speed competition in Perm, it also played a big role in the Lead competition, as well. In the IFSC Lead World Cup, five women (Fakhritdinova, Kim, Markovic, Oda and Röck) were leading in a tie after the Semi-finals. Jain Kim was the only athlete to top out in the final round taking home the Gold medal, followed by Magdalena Röck, Momoka Oda and Mina Markovic ex aequo with a height of 32+. So in the end the attempted time in the finals decided the rest of the podium and meant Magdalena Röck got her first Silver medal in an IFSC World Cup competition, Bronze went to Japan's Momoka Oda.

The men's competition was marked by a flood of tops until the finals, with nine athletes placed in a tie going into the Finals! In the deciding round, reigning European champion Ramón Julian Puigblanque showed the toughest performance with a height of 45. Close behind him was Puurs winner Jakob Schubert (43+) who won Silver, and Bronze went to Korea's Hyunbin Min (37+).

This September 20th and 21st, expect a weekend full of tough competition, exciting climbing action and old acquaintances coming head-to-head: for the tenth year in a row the city of Puurs is hosting the IFSC Lead World Cup in Flanders, Belgium.

The IFSC Lead World Cup in Puurs is known as “the Belgian place to be” for climbing fans and athletes. For a decade by now the Klimax semi-outdoors climbing dome has offered a great ambiance within the World Cup series – and not only for the WC participants! Competition visitors will not only get to enjoy the acrobatics of the world’s best, but they will also have the opportunity to show-off their talents in the big dyno contest, on slack lines or in the speleo box. What could be better?

Head-to-head in Flanders

In the pro’s competition tension will be high in the two anticipated neck-and-neck races: With his victory at the last IFSC Lead World Cup in Imst at the beginning of August Japan’s Sachi Amma assumed the leadership in the overall ranking, 15 points ahead of Lead legend and previous year’s winner in Puurs, Ramón Julian Puigblanque. Same, same but different tells the female ranking: Here it’s multi-discipline athlete Mina Markovic leading the field with a 15-point advantage of – as well - previous year’s winner in Puurs, Jain Kim. The third places in the current overall rankings go to France, represented by H el ene Janicot resp. constantly strong Manuel Romain.

So it’s gonna get hot at the Puurs Lead World Cup, starting with the qualifications on Friday, September 20th, at 11:00 a.m. (GMT+2). Semi-finals for men and women will take place the next day, on Saturday, September 21st, at 10:45 a.m. (GMT+2). The kick-off of the Belgian finals will take place at 5:30 p.m. (GMT+2) – watch it live on www.ifsc-climbing.org!
